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

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Answer With Explanation

1. Answer: A

In the midst of a **raging** second wave, which is touching new peaks each passing day, the Central government has **abdicated** its responsibility to ensure vaccine equity through free vaccination for the poor across all age groups.

Raging – angry, furious, fuming

Abdicated – capitulated, succumbed, relented

2. Answer: B

With this **precedent**, States will probably be required to vaccinate children too, when vaccines become available, thus **Burdening** them even further and thereby actively promoting vaccine inequity.

Precedent – example, pattern, paradigm

Burdening - loading, overwhelming, hampering

3. Answer: D

Moreover, the wide scale distress and profiteering from distress through **hoarding** and **exorbitantly** priced selling of essential items and services also make clear the virtue of having an equitable and decentralized health care system.

Hoarding - advertisement, banner

Exorbitantly – unduly, immensely

4. Answer: E

10) Answer: A

As per the context of the sentence it mentions that the block chain technology helps to raise seed capital for startups that are funded at competitive rates. Hence the words combination in option A fits suitably completing the sentence meaningfully. The word "capitalization" in option B does not fill the blanks in the sentence grammatically. In option C and D the words "activities" and "promotions" do not sound right for the blank. Option E is not a right choice.

Option A is correct answer

11) Answer: C

The statement is a declaration or a law or from a speech. The word "legislature" given in option A is wrong making the combination incorrect. The word "static" right does not make sense hence option B is wrong. The word "foundation" and "assertion" are incorrect for the blanks. In option C, the word "fundamental" fits rightly with rights of women and the word "declaration" sounds correct for the other blank, completing the sentence meaningfully.

Therefore, Option C is the correct answer.

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12) Answer: B

From the given options, A is a wrong combination for the words "single" period or "paid" is grammatically unfit for the blanks. In option C, application of "the multiple" is grammatically incorrect. In option D, "allocation" is unfit for the blank. Hence in option B, the words fit correctly and make the sentence meaningful with their application.

Therefore, Option B is the correct answer.

13) Answer: C

Therefore, Option C is the correct answer.

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
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
